PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Temperatures of 70 degrees a week before Thanksgiving.... the weather this fall has been incredible. I cannot remember a year where the fall has been as warm as this year. Just great for flying.

Speaking of flying, the winter months are no reason to hang up your transmitter. Fly Indoor...!!! With the advent of electric power, Indoor flying is no longer constrained to just rubber power. Indoor 3-D, Indoor Heli's or just plain Indoor Foamies... they are all great fun and relatively inexpensive. Our good friends at the Mid Hudson Modelmasters have invited us to fly at any one of their scheduled Indoor events at the SUNY Ulster gym. The Calendar of Events in this newsletter will list the time and dates of these events. The SUNY Ulster gym is a premier place to fly...probably one of the best in our overall area. If there is sufficient interest, we could arrange some flying time at one of the gyms in our local school systems.

To whet your appetite a little further for Indoor flying, the next meeting will feature an in-depth discussion and show and tell of all the types of models being flown at these Indoor events. Electric as well as Rubber power will be discussed. We have several experts in our organization who will show you everything you need to know and answer all questions. Plan on being there.

At the last meeting, we spent an hour discussing what type of events you, the general members, would like to see in the near future. A winter fun fly, a swap shop and a project night were discussed. We have taken the initiative to start the hall reservation process for both the Swap Shop in February and Project night in April. It was decided not to schedule a fixed date for a January Fun Fly and be at the mercy of the weather but rather watch the weather forecast and announce a fun fly over the internet a few days before. We need a few volunteers to buy food and cook the day of the Fun Fly. This is a short duration

job.... how about stepping forward and volunteering.

We flew at the Aerodrome for the last time this season on Wednesday, November 9th. This was my first time flying at this site as I was out of town for the previous flying session. We flew just a little North of where circle two used to be at the Jamboree for those of you that remember that far back. I have flown at many different sites in the course of my Sailplane contest tours but let me say that I was very pleasantly surprised at how accommodating the Aerodrome is to model flying. First of all, the tree line is much further away than it is at Hopewell and the take off and landing approaches on that 2500-foot runway are just terrific. I found the Aerodrome to be a very fine place to fly, a place capable of having separate airplane, heli and sailplane areas going simultaneously. What else could a club ask? We took some time to explore the area and found a place on the North end of the runway where a road could be cut in with relatively little effort. This could give us a method of entering the property without disturbing the main area, the full-scale area, of the Aerodrome. So, given that we have Hopewell for another year unless one of us dumps one in the shopping center, our course of action should be to continue to develop the Aerodrome as a flying site by presenting our proposal to the Aerodrome Board of Directors and continuing to show interest by flying up there.... perhaps one or two Wednesdays a month. Volunteering in the form of a work party or two in the Spring to help them get the place going would go a long way to cementing relationships. What do you think....? Pro or con... talk it up at the field, at the diner or at the meetings.

Last but not least, let me remind you of the Club Holiday Party. Friday, December 16th at Umberto's located across the street from the Poughkeepsie Ford Dealership on Rt. 9. Members free, guests are \$25 each. There will be well over \$500 in prizes given out. One catch, you MUST register for this event with Dick Kalbfus by December 7th.
