Jonathan Elie Solos! Congratulations to our own Jonathan Elie for his successful solo in a full scale sailplane. In his own words: "Hi everyone

I went flying today at a new field with a long paved runway. I clocked my plane at 65 MPH. Can you beleive, I got it up to 2500 feet - without binoculars. How did I do this you ask? I was flying *in* it!

I soloed on a full scale glider today at Wurtsboro Airport. I started out the day taking a couple flights with my instructor, lasting just 10 minutes each, cause it was a calm day with no thermals. On my third flight, sitting on the ground getting ready to take off again, the ground crew hooked the rope to my plane and I gave the tow pilot the signal to take off. It was a normal takeoff with my instructor; one of the smoothest takeoffs of the day. After about 30 seconds, at about 300 feet I hear a big clink. I started to lose airspeed and immediately realized that my instructor pulled the cable release to test me, so I did a sharp turn back to the airport and landed downwind with an 8 knot tailwind. The landing was pretty good and we went right back up again. After such short flights, my instructor asked me if I wanted to solo. At first I was very nervous. I sat down and thought about it for about a half hour while someone else was using the glider. I started to think to myself, it'll be fine, so once the glider landed I got in the cockpit, checked over everything, closed the canopy, and signaled the tow pilot to take off. The takeoff was a little scary but I got used to flying without my instructor. Once the tow plane got up to 2500 feet I looked to my right - there was no traffic, so I released the cable and turned to the right. After that, it was just like any normal flight. I flew around for a little bit and then started to setup for a landing. On final approach, the runway looked a little far away to me so I came off the air brake and flared for the landing and landed a tiny bit short, but the landing was still smooth. After that I got out of the plane and everybody was congratulating me. My instructor asked if I wanted to go up again, and I said sure. It was an awesome day! Jonathan
