  - When flying at Wallkill and leaving at the end of the day, please tip the flight stations to minimize bird droppings.
  - o If you fly using 2.4 frequency, you still need to use the frequency board.
  - Suggest keeping a garbage bag in your flight box to pick up after crashes, and or general housekeeping, especially cigarette butts.
- The following proposal for change to the bylaws was made:

## ARTICLE TWO: PURPOSE

Section One: The primary purpose of this organization shall be to promote and advance the building and flying of fixed wing radio controlled model aircraft.

## ARTICLE THREE: MEMBERSHIP

Section One: All members shall be actively interested in the construction and flying of fixed wing radio controlled aircraft.

Section Nine: No MHRCS member joining the organization after April 1, 2010 may fly a helicopter at any MHRCS field. Current MHRCS helicopter pilots or any current member as of April 1, 2010 may continue to fly helicopters at any MHRCS field.

Warren discussed the issue in general, with questions and answers from members. A vote by paper ballot was held. The proposal passed with 27 "yes", and 1 "no".

• Jesse mentioned that our very own member, Jonathan Elie, coached a Science Olympiad team in Connecticut. The team won the Connecticut section.
