Ed Popko, a new member of MHRCS, is an avid sailplane flier. A U-control modeler in the 1950s (combat and rat race) he took up modeling again in 1980, this time sailplanes and his first Airtronics 100" Olympic II and high-start launcher. He joined the well known Boston area Charles River Radio Control Club and became active in the Eastern Soaring League contests and flew 2M, standard (100") and open class sailplanes (>100").

Employment with IBM brought him to the Hudson Valley where he continued flying sailplanes in local school yards and hay fields. Soon he found other sailplane flyers and together they formed the Hudson Valley Soaring Society and sponsored several regional AMA contests (Ed is a CD). By the mid-90s, he has achieved Level IV League of Silent Flight certification before he stopped flying to take up family needs and his son's interests. He re-entered modeling again in 2013 with a commemorative flight, again with his original 1980 Olympic II sailplane (which now qualifies for 'Classic' category in contests).

Ed is a scratch builder and catching up to the new

materials and building techniques has been his focus for completed his first, contest quality, all composite the past two years. He has been tutoring under master builder and MHRCS's member Bob Magee. He has just sailplane (Kevlar/Carbon Fiber, foam, vacuum bagged composite). Ed likes to mold parts such as fuselages, canopies, etc. out of fiberglass, carbon fiber or Kevlar. Besides the new materials and techniques, Ed is very impressed with the advances in batteries, motors and programmable radios for full-house planes. He now flies electric sailplanes in addition to winch launch and hopes to enter his first Altitude Limited Electric Sailplane (ALES) contests this season.
