"All mailed renewal applications must contain a copy of AMA card and a self addressed stamped envelope. Membership cards will not be returned unless both of these items are provided."

Additionally, **Make checks payable to MHRCS, only.**

Checks made out to the Membership Director or anyone else will not be deposited.

Something to be aware of...

As many of you are aware by now, the AMA changed its billing policy last year so that your membership is on a rolling 12-month basis, where single- and multi-year AMA memberships had previously started 1 Jan and ended 31 Dec of any year.

This new policy puts the burden on individual clubs of assuring all club members are active AMA members according to the rolling cycle. It used to be a simple matter for MHRCS to check for AMA membership at the time of club renewal (beginning of the calendar year).

Jer is having to add AMA membership information for each MHRCS member on a monthly basis. This adds a complication and we ask everyone to be prompt with submitting your records at your AMA renewal date to minimize Jer's effort to maintain this now-monthly updated information.

Builder's Corner

Here's an item that Jer Milosek sent in – sounds like sage, hard-won wisdom coming from some trial and error with finishing aircraft:

A word about using Rustoleum rattle can's.

I used Rustoleum primer recently while finishing a model. Its totally incompatible with the rest of the world. Once you apply Rustoleum that model is married to it forever.

DO NOT USE ANYTHING BUT RUSTOLEUM OVER IT!!!

If you visit a car restoration site you will find many posts complaining about it. For example, it does not inhibit rust.

Guys used it on their cars without putting on paint. Its so porous that rust occurred between the primer and the metal.

The paint I was applying on top is a solvent based paint, it was not water based.

Remember finishing's Cardinal Rule:

DO NOT MIX MANUFACTURERS.
